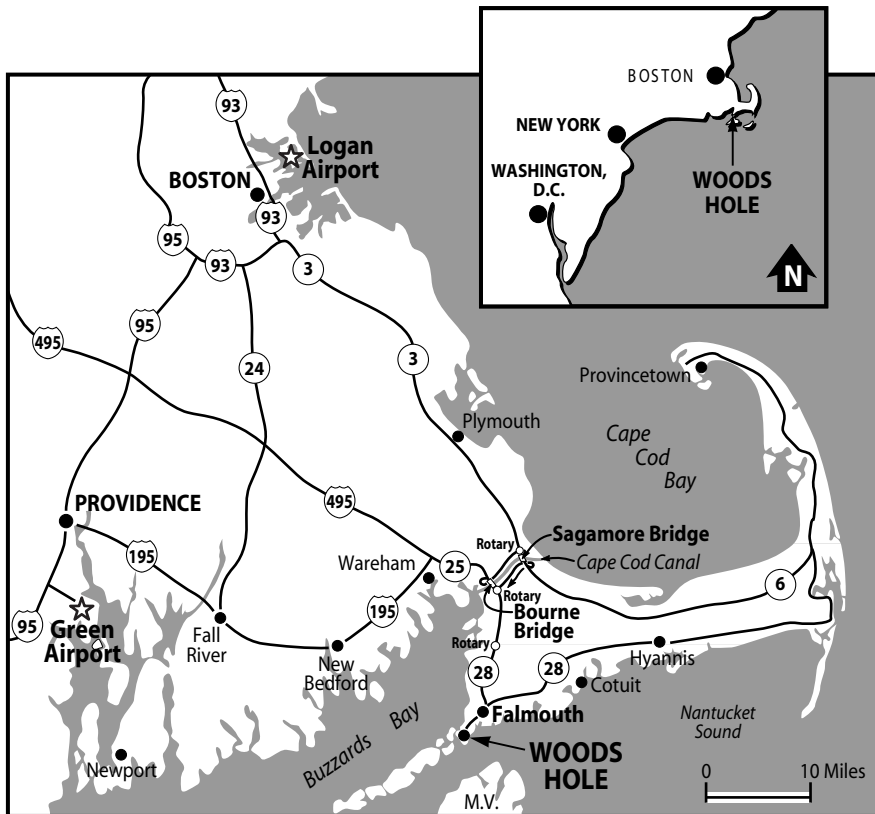




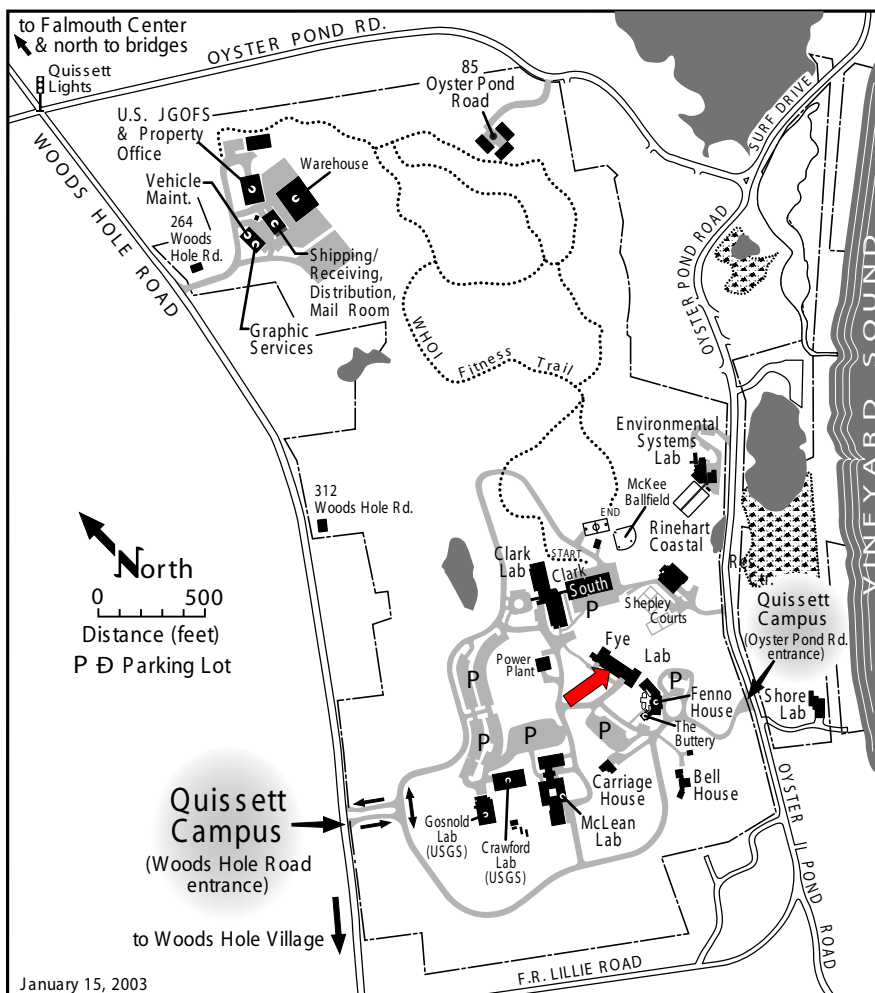
Directions to WHOI, Fenno House

From Boston, MA (~80 miles)

- Take Route 3 south, following signs for Cape Cod.
- Cross the Sagamore Bridge, take the first exit off Route 6, and continue to the traffic light.
- At the light turn left, following signs for Falmouth and Route 28.
- Travel south along the Cape Cod Canal to the next rotary.
- Travel three-quarters of the way around the rotary, exiting the rotary to Route 28 south toward "Falmouth and the Islands."
- Continue south on Route 28, traveling through the next rotary and on toward Falmouth.
- As the divided highway ends, proceed into the Town of Falmouth.
- Go through the traffic light (at Jones Road) and continue south on Route 28 toward Woods Hole.
- At the fork with the blinking light after the Gulf gas station, bear right onto Woods Hole Road.
- At the next traffic light (Quissett Lights), turn left onto Oyster Pond Road.
- At the stop sign, turn right, continuing on Oyster Pond Road.
- Take the 3rd right; the WHOI sign reads "Quissett Campus."
- Travel up the drive toward Fenno House; parking is available to the right of the circular drive.

From Providence, RI (~75 miles)

- Take Route 195 east, then Route 25 east, following signs for Cape Cod.
- Cross the Bourne Bridge, travel halfway around the rotary, exiting the rotary to Route 28 south toward "Falmouth and the Islands."
- Continue south on Route 28, traveling through the next rotary and on toward Falmouth.
- As the divided highway ends, proceed into the Town of Falmouth.
- Go through the traffic light (at Jones Road) and continue south on Route 28 toward Woods Hole.
- At the fork with the blinking light after the Gulf gas station, bear right onto Woods Hole Road.
- At the next traffic light (Quissett Lights), turn left onto Oyster Pond Road.
- At the stop sign, turn right, continuing on Oyster Pond Road.
- Take the 3rd right ; the WHOI sign reads "Quissett Campus."
